History of Founding Celebrations.

On May 3rd, members of the Historic Committee will be the featured speakers at the Wednesday night "Taste and See" Program on the topic of St. Paul's Bicentennial Planning. In anticipation of St. Paul's 200th parish anniversary in August 2027 we have been researching how the church marked its important milestones through the years.

We discovered that the church celebrated on the 100th, 125th and 150th anniversaries of its founding. In 1927, the Bishop of Tennessee preached a special morning sermon

previous priests. The sanctuary must have been overflowing because former parishioners came from "as far away as New York and Florida," according to newspaper accounts and reports on attendance varied from between 500 to 1,000 people. After the morning service a lunch was served that would have made today's Women and Men of St. Paul's proud (see the attached description from the newspaper). In the afternoon, a special commemoration service was held with special speeches by the mayor and local dignitaries.

WOMEN OF ST. PAUL'S


