Walk in Love: A Pilgrimage of Remembrance

On April 19th, 1960, in the height of the Civil Rights Movement in Nashville, the Meharry Blvd. home of renowned civil rights Attorney, Z. Alexander Looby was destroyed by a bomb. In response to this horror, *thousands* of community members gathered at the site and began a silent march, led by student activist Diane Nash and others, up Jefferson St. to the Public Square where they confronted then Mayor Ben West. As a result of this encounter, Mayor West declared that businesses in downtown Nashville would be desegregated and Nashville has never looked back on that promise.

To help us keep alive the legacy of Atty. Z. Alexander Looby and other Nashville heroes of the Civil Rights movement, we welcome you to participate in a commemorative silent march from the site of Looby's home to the Public Square on **April 19th, 2018, from 6:30-8:30pm.**

Each year the march grows larger, but it takes ALL of us to represent the level of solidarity that existed on that fateful day in 1960. Please join us in commemorating our proud history of peaceful resistance and accomplishment in the city of Nashville, for all to see.
