St. Paul's Service of Remembrance finally happened this past Wednesday August 26 at 6:00 pm. The possibility of having a service to honor and remember an enslaved people who were baptized from St. Paul's, any enslaved people who labored to build this church has been weighing on the hearts and minds of people for years. Thank you to everyone who had any part in making it a reality.In case you missed it, Bishop John Bauerschmidt, from our Diocese was here to officiate, and Rev. Rick Britton from St. Anselm's in Nashville was here to preach. There were people in the pews and people watching online. The prayers were powerful, the music was amazing, and the preaching was inspired.

Here are a few prayers from the service:

For this community, that every heart may be kindled with a desire for equality, respect, and opportunity for all. Give us courage to strive for justice and peace among all people, beginning here at home.

We pray to you, Lord Christ. Lord, hear our prayer.

For this parish of St. Paul's: We regret our complicity to the institution of slavery. We apologize for the injury done by the institution of slavery and its aftermath. WITS (Women in Theological Study)



Help Record St. Paul's History



To the good people of St. Paul's parish, Franklin:

The Historic Committee of St. Paul's would like to extend an invitation to the communicants of our church. These are unprecedented times; moreover, these are historic times. It is important that this epoch is recorded on every level, including that of our own church family. Please begin a journal regarding your experiences of late. Include your daily activities, news, as well as your thoughts and feelings about these never-before-seen events. There are no rules: you can be as verbose or as filtered as you wish. You can express it in poetry, with humor, whatever you prefer. The idea is to capture what you are doing and how you are reacting and especially on a spiritual level. This will allow you to express yourself, keep yourself from getting bored, and, best of all, it will record this moment for future generations who will likely find this all very interesting—just as the interest of the history of the Spanish influenza epidemic of 1918 has been rekindled now—100 years later.

When this pandemic has become a thing of the past, and it will indeed end, please donate a copy of your journal to the St Paul's Archives for the purpose of documenting and archiving the details of the Covid-19 virus and how it affected our parish. Each individual story will help make one great collective history about how this newly emergent virus and its global spread has impacted the members of our church. You can even make this a family project and include your children's stories if you like. Imagine decades from now when they have children and grandchildren of their own and have a written record to recall what would otherwise be long forgotten. We are literally experiencing history in the making. Therefore, this committee looks forward to seeing the variety of ways it has impacted us all. Until then, stay safe and have a blessed Easter season!

When it comes to writing your journal entries, consider the following questions:

How has your daily routine changed as a result of the pandemic? Did you have to stay home to care for your children? Did your place of business close? Were you able to work from home? Did you still get paid during this time? Did social distancing change your shopping habits - the frequency or what you bought? How did you explain this to your children? Did anyone you know get sick? Did you have to convince your parents or another family member to isolate? How did you cope with the potential of getting the virus? How are you altering your habits, work life, and living arrangements to cope with the larger pandemic and our local shelter-in-place order?

You can also describe your thoughts on the pandemic, including how you feel about it, and your observations of what's happening in society around us. If you've got children at home, you can encourage them to document their thoughts and experiences as well or even create a shared family journal, as children are chronically underrepresented in the historical record.
