November Summary:

With one month to go the parish had a lower performance than expected in November, especially in revenues.

Revenues: Pledges and cash-in-plate were lower than expected for the month of November, but still exceed year-to-date expectations. Cash-In-Plate has met the budget for the year a month early.

Expenses: Expenses were lower in Personnel and higher in operations but remarkably came in almost exactly on budget for the month of November.

The single largest expense increase was payments from Outreach.

Overall: With one month to go, the parish remains nearly \$70,000 ahead of expectations.

Capital Campaign:

- On track to pay all expenses in January
- More money was spent than our contingency allowed
- 237 pledging units in the Capital Campaign, we still need to collect money

Finance Committee:

- Budget process packets going out to staff
- Finance committee meets in January-budget will require some degree of amending as new building expenses are not completely known at this point.

Stewardship:

Stewardship met and exceeded the goal of \$1.2 million.

Although new people are pledging, we have not met our goal of pledging units yet
